Application steps

Application	Once officially nominated, send the following documents to the international department : <u>international@esad-orleans.fr</u> - <u>Application form</u> , - CV, - Motivation letter, - Portfolio (PDF files only), - Passport photo, - Copy of your passport/ID card. <u>Application deadlines</u> : - Autumn semester: May 1 st 2024 - Spring semester: November 1 st 2024
Admission	Admission to ESAD Orléans is validated by a selection committee (teachers and administration) after the examination of the application file and depending on available places. A note of acceptance will be sent to the student by email within 5 weeks after the application deadline at the latest.

<u>Language</u>

Most courses are given in French and it is preferable that students are able to communicate in our language. However, some teachers and students communicate easily in English to international students.

If you're not fluent in French, level required in English is B1.

Students also benefit from an agreement with the Institut de français of the University of Orléans that offers French classes at all levels for exchange students. The semester course costs only **65€ per student**. Students are divided into 4 levels: Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced, Superior. Each student can take a written French course and/or an oral French course and/or a grammar French course. Classes take place in the evening from 17:30 to 19:00. Information will be sent with the acceptance letter.

<u>Credits</u>

We use the ECTS system with 30 credits for each semester. The grading system gives marks on 20 points.

<u>Fees</u>

Students accepted as part of an exchange programme are not required to pay registration fees at ESAD Orléans.

Insurance

Every student living in France needs to be health insured. If you come from a European country, you must ask for your European health insurance card in your home country. For non-EU students you must ask your insurance company at home if it insures you abroad.

<u>Visa</u>

EU students do not need a visa.

Non-EU students need one. They should contact the sending and receiving institutions if they need support.

Accommodation

The Orléans School of Art and Design has a few one or two rooms apartments reserved for exchange students in a public residence (very limited places).

These apartments are located in the Residence Dessaux (2 rue de la Folie - 45000 Orléans).

To benefit from it, you must tell the international relations department which will put you in contact with the services of the Résidence Dessaux.
